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

The first session, for Form 3 girls, was hosted by Sybil Amoah and Yaa Serwah Tuffour of Enterprise Computing, both old girls from another year group. The second session was led by AOGA 9496/94D and PRESEC 9496/94D alumni, inspiring the students to dream big.

That evening, we gathered at the Peduase Valley Resort for a fun-filled night of grills and dancing.

The festivities continued on Saturday, August 3, 2024, with a serene morning and afternoon spent at the Safari Valley Resort in Adukrom, followed by an energetic karaoke session with the girls on the lower court of the school.

The weekend culminated in a heartfelt thanksgiving service at the Joyce Asibey Hall on Sunday, August 4, 2024, where we reflected on the past three decades and gave thanks for the journey we have shared.

The refurbishment of the computer lab came at a cost of GHS300,000 a significant but worthy investment in the future of STEM education at Aburi Girls.

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A Seamless Transition of Leadership: 1996D Election 2024 Process

s mandated by the year group's constitution, the time had come to initiate the election process for new executives to lead the group for the next three years (2025-2028).

As Abraham Lincoln once said, "Democracy is the government of the people, by the people, for the people." Elections, the very tool of democracy, can sometimes be turbulent when transparency and engagement are lacking. To ensure members felt confident in this process, a three-member electoral committee(EC) was nominated with a clear mandate to:

- · Ensure a free and fair election
- Guarantee that all members, wherever located, could vote easily
- Establish clear timelines and implement support systems throughout the election period.

The team sought the services of Defalis Concept Ltd, a local vendor, to facilitate the election. Working closely with the EC, they ensured the process was seamless.

Effective communication was key, and all members were kept informed at every stage of the process. Pre-election marketing and communications over a three-week period whipped up enthusiasm and ensured high engagement. The election timeline was as follows:

29/08/24 – Official announcement of the election process and opening of the voters' register for verification of member details.

12/09/24 to 15/09/24 - Nominations period.

16/09/24 - Nominees announced.

17/09/24 - Endorsements completed.

18/09/24 – Verification and confirmation of the voters' register. Emails and unique voting codes

sent to members.

20/09/24 to 22/09/24 - Voting period.

23/09/24 - Results announced.

Voting was conducted online through a unique member ID sent to each verified email address. Members could vote only once.

The EC is proud of the peaceful, transparent, and seamless transition of leadership. The handing-over ceremony will be held in December at the annual end-of-year gathering.

Sincere thanks to the outgoing executives for their unwavering support during this transition and for the trust they placed in the EC to fulfill their responsibilities effectively. Their dedication and leadership have been instrumental in guiding the team through this process, and we sincerely appreciate all that they have done for 1996D.
